Social Development: A Hand Up, Not A Hand Out

I am extraordinarily pleased to announce that, after many months of proposals, meetings, setbacks and red tape, MID has officially partnered with U-Turn to set up a Service Centre for street people Muizenberg.

U-Turn is an NGO that has been running rehabilitation programs in Cape Town since 1997 with an excellent track record.

The U-Turn programe is expected to launch in mid-March and initially focus on a service centre where homeless people can access meals twice a day via a voucher system. Residents will be able to buy vouchers from local businesses, which will enable residents to give responsibly to people in need. Twinned with the meal program is a voluntary rehabilitation programe that equips people with the skills needed to overcome homelessness.



MID has committed to partially funding U-Turn's Muizenberg Service Centre and we will be sending out a special newsletter and pamphlets explaining the programe in full detail shortly. In the interim, learn more about U-Turn's work here. And please also check out their YouTube channel here.

I'm excited to get my 'hands dirty' to further green Muizenberg by:


- 1. Planting up public spaces.
